The annual 'JS' series of business meetings are designed to be of value and interest to laser job shops. In so doing, they facilitate trust between businesses that compete, in order for them to work together on topics of common interest or concern. The first of these took place in 2001 and never have they been more important than in these last few difficult years. The strength and the benefits of the job shop group grows with the number of members we have and, as last year, we are inviting a lot of the jobshops who haven't yet attended to come along and see for themselves the benefits of belonging to a friendly group of competitors.

The theme of this year's event is 'Opportunities with new technologies' and the meeting includes a keynote presentation about additive manufacturing and others on nitrogen generators, laser marking and the benefits of social media.

At JS 2012 a number of members reported that they had successfully won a significant amount of grant money so, back by popular demand, we have

invited HSBC to discuss the availability of grants for subcontractors. We are especially delighted that the HSBC Chief Economist is also coming along to speak on aspects of the UK Economy and where it's heading.

Other topics include the ever popular overview of results of the 2013 job shop surveys (i.e. the range of charges for electricity and gases and user satisfaction with the service provided when flatbed cutting machines break down); together with some short commercial presentations on laser cutting-related equipment, materials and services. And after a good feed we will have our general open question and answer session led by a panel of jobshop owners - this years panel will include Mark Hutchinson of Hutchinson Engineering (2013 MTA Award for the most dynamic subcontractor) and myself, but it is an open forum where everyone is welcome to participate and it usually gets rather noisy!

It may sound odd to discuss things with competitors but those who have taken part in the past know that you can learn a lot without discussing commercially sensitive information. For example, we may compare the financial services offered by our banks; variations in steel prices or where to buy the cheapest lenses. Everyone involved gets useful information

that may save them thousands of pounds. Sounds like an old boys network? - it is, but without the funny hand shake, so come and join us! The day will be rounded off by an opportunity to tour recent developments at MSS including N2 generators and refurbished flatbed laser cutting machines; it should be very interesting.


